## **Division Update...**

**Right Now:** The California version of PRB-1 passed the state Assembly on a vote of 67-0 on April 10. Then the bill was sent to the state Senate where it received its first reading. It now awaits assignment to a Senate committee. Stay tuned for further progress reports!

**Right Now:** In Washington D.C., Rep Steve Israel (D-NY) has again introduced the "Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Consistency Act" into the current session of Congress. The measure, designated HR 1478, would require private land-use regulators such as homeowners' associations to reasonably accommodate Amateur Radio antennas consistent with the PRB-1 limited federal preemption. Please write to your Congressman/woman and ask him/her to become a co-sponsor of HR-1478. More info and a sample letter are located at:
